Defbrillator Update

The defibrillator at the Old School was out of action during the very cold weather we experienced in February/March due to the battery in the defibrillator



reacting to the cold temperatures. The cabinet it is stored in has a heating element and should have kept it at a temperature above zero degrees, however it turned out that the cabinet was faulty and the heating element and the insulation failed. To resolve this and avoid a repetition we have now installed a new cabinet which is of a much better design. The defibrillator is now charged and fully working. (The defibrillator cabinet at Fenhill is of a different design and so should not have this problem).

Highways

Cllr Stowe is still pursuing Highways on our behalf to change the junction at the Blockley turning from a 'give way' to a 'stop' junction following several accidents where motorists have ended up hitting the wall and the signposts.

Cllr Stowe is also assisting us to install traffic measuring equipment at three locations, to help provide data that will support any recommendations for traffic calming actions. The equipment will be rubber strips across the road with data capture boxes at the kerbside. The locations suggested are at the top of the village near the Blockley turning, at the pinch-point in the middle of the village and near to the Fenhill Close junction.

The potholes around the manholes up near the Longborough turning have been reported to Highways, as has the poor state of Back Lane.

There has been damage to several kerbs/verges by the bin lorries as they manoeuvre past parked cars, these will be reinstated in the next few weeks.

Community Speedwatch

We are delighted that Camilla Chandler has started to organize the village Speedwatch program. (more details later in this copy of the Bugle).

New Trees Offer

The County Council has felled over 3,000 ash



trees due to the spread of ash dieback in the region. It is anticipated that the final number will be 30,000, however their target is to plant 3.5 million trees over the next 10 years. With this in mind, in the autumn they will be offering Parish Councils free trees to plant which will include our Community Orchard and private gardens. If you would like to be included, please email the clerk and we will be in touch in the planting season.

Annual Parish Meeting Postponed

This meeting has been postponed until the summer, when Covid-19 restrictions will hopefully have been lifted and it will be safer for us to meet. It will be an opportunity for new and long standing residents to catch up on all the village activities, including updates from the Old School Hall, Community Orchard, Help in Need Charity and the Educational Trust.

THE OLD SCHOOL



Sadly, due to Covid 19 restrictions the Old

School Hall has had to remain closed since March 2020.

General maintenance has continued, including renewal of the emergency lighting and fire alarm systems. Refurbishment of the kitchen has been completed. The roof has been repaired, although we are still waiting for further work on the chimney. Over the next few weeks, the floors in the main and back halls will be sanded and revarnished prior to re-opening.

The hall will be open for the first time in over a year on Thursday 6th May as the Polling Station for elections for Councillors and Police & Crime Commissioner. There will be a one-way system and other measures to keep everyone safe. You are encouraged to bring your own pen or pencil to mark the ballot papers.

We are planning to resume indoor events when all Covid restrictions are lifted. These will include a Cheese and Wine event, postponed from March 2020, and coffee mornings. We realise that there are a number of new residents in the village, who unfortunately we have not had the chance to meet and make welcome.

Rural Cinema evenings are expected to resume in September.

COMMUNITY SPEEDWATCH

A team of villagers has set up a new Community Speed Watch group in conjunction with Gloucestershire Police & local enforcement teams.



The campaign will monitor speed & trafficrelated issues throughout Bourton-in-the-Hill in order to:

- Raise awareness of the high speeds passing through the village in both directions.
- **Provide data** to support efforts to lobby Gloucestershire Highways to improve road safety in the village.
- Reduce vehicle speeds, motoring offences & anti-social driving, thereby improving quality of life.

The new team was trained to use a radar gun by local police on Maundy Thursday and has completed 4 days of observations so far. In spite of the inevitable reduction in speed prompted by a group of high-vis jackets stationed in full view by the roadside (!!) the data collected already demonstrates the scale of the issue in Bourton, with 40% of vehicles passing through the village at illegal speeds. We intend to run regular checks going forward and would love to expand this by investing in 1 or more radar guns to enable simultaneous checks at multiple points in the village.

Ways you can help:

• Volunteer to join the CSW team: we have 9 committed members encompassing dogwalkers, young families, those in full-time work and retired villagers. No experience or fixed time commitments necessary!

- Contribute to the purchase of an independent set of radar guns for the operation these cost c. £170 each. Buying our own set will remove reliance on sharing with police and/or other local speed watch teams and increase the scope of the data gathered.
- Communicate any day-to-day incidents that you witness; express your support for the campaign so we can build a greater picture of the impact of dangerous driving on the community.

BOURTON HOUSE GARDEN


Spring is officially here and with that comes the opening of Bourton House Garden for our 2021 season!

FOODBANK APPEAL

This has been an incredibly challenging year and the North Cotswold Foodbank has seen an increase in the numbers of people needing emergency help as well as extraordinary acts of generosity and kindness. The difference this year has been that we have seen clients who up until recently had run successful businesses especially in the hospitality sector which have had to remain closed and also very sadly more broken relationships due to the pressures of lockdown.

In good news the new outlet opening at Stow Baptist Church is set for April 21st. They have a good number of volunteers and Stow Rugby Club are getting involved too. In Moreton, the generous financial donations have helped us give out fresh bread from Bourton on the Water bakers and meat/veg vouchers for Walkers Butchers on the High Street. This helps us improve the quality of our food parcels as the quality of meat/protein in tins isn't

Again because of generous donations we have been able to provide for a Citizen Advice Bureau (CAB) advisor in Bourton on the Water and Winchcombe to extend their hours. She has already helped so many more clients which is very encouraging.

We are continuing to maintain good working relationship with our referral agencies as they give out vouchers to those in need. These include the GP surgeries, social services, P3, Citizens Advice Bureau (CAB), Christians Against Poverty (CAP) and the school liaison workers especially at Stow, St David's and Chipping Campden.

Covid -19 update

Extract from update to parish clerks, dated 9th April 2021.

On Monday 5 April, the Government confirmed plans for easing restrictions across England from 12 April. Outdoor pubs, shops, gyms and hairdressers can reopen. Outdoor gatherings must still be limited to 6 people or 2 households, and you must not socialise indoors with anyone you do not live with or have not formed a support bubble with.

Everyone in England without symptoms will be able to get twice weekly rapid Covid-19 tests from Friday 9 April Community Collect points have opened at all four of GCC's community testing centres to complement on site testing. Government has also launched Pharmacy Collect, which pharmacies will be joining over the coming weeks. To find your nearest testing or collection site, visit the NHS website.
